


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Palabras ajenas (The Words of Others)

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Palabras ajenas (The Words of Others) is a literary collage created by Argentinian artist León Ferrari in the form of a dramatic script published in 1967. Ferrari composed this important Vietnam-era anti-war piece by cutting and assembling texts and quotations from various sources, including news agencies, history books, the Bible, and speeches by political and religious figures such as President Lyndon B. Johnson, Robert McNamara, Pope Paul VI and Adolf Hitler. Partial readings of this work were performed in 1968, under the direction of artist Leopoldo Maler, at the Arts Lab in London, a pioneer space for experimental art; and in 1972 at the Larrañaga Theater in Buenos Aires, staged by independent theater director Pedro Asquini. In 2017 *Palabras ajenas* was performed for the first time in its total duration at REDCAT theater and staged by Ruth Estévez, José Antonio Sánchez, and Juan Ernesto Díaz.

This durational performance activates the words of key characters and journalistic sources during times of war, through a "chorus" of contemporary voices. *The Words of Others* is an essential political piece in León Ferrari's body of work. This recovery of his literary collage constitutes a tribute to him as an artist and a citizen, and is a gesture in defense of culture, democracy, and civil rights.

Palabras ajenas es un collage literario creado por el artista argentino León Ferrari en forma de un guión dramático, publicado en 1967. Ferrari compuso esta pieza anti guerra de Vietnam a partir de recortes de textos y citas sacados de varias fuentes, entre ellas cables de noticias, prensa internacional y nacional, libros de historias, la biblia, discursos de líderes políticos y religiosos como el Presidente Lyndon Johnson, Robert McNamara, Pope Paul VI y Adolph Hitler, entre otros. La obra se leyó públicamente y de forma parcial en dos ocasiones, una en 1968 bajo la dirección artística de Leopoldo Maler, en el Arts Lab de Londres, un espacio pionero de arte experimental; y en 1972, en el Teatro Larrañaga de Buenos Aires, llevada a escena por el director de teatro independiente Pedro Asquini. En 2017, *Palabras ajenas* se mostró en su total duración en el REDCAT bajo la dirección de Ruth Estévez, José Antonio Sánchez y Juan Ernesto Díaz.

Este performance duracional activa las voces de personajes clave y periodistas durante las diferentes guerras, formando un coro de voces contemporáneas. *Palabras ajenas* es una obra esencial del teatro político en el cuerpo de obra de León Ferrari. La recuperación de este collage literario supone un tributo a Ferrari como artista y ciudadano, además de un gesto en defensa de la cultura, la democracia y los derechos humanos.
