Storytelling allows teachers to enter the lives of students as they're forming a sense of self- identity. it promotes a sense of community and belonging, enables relationship networking, allows participants to engage in sense-making, helps develop empathy and self-confidence, and facilitates learning (Zepeda, 2014).



FIRST SESSION

Storytelling as means of education tool

The storytelling technique is known to be one of the most effective teaching strategies.

Children learn new experiences and knowledge as well as values and culture from the same story.

Story listening involves the active engagement of the child. Children get a chance to explore more knowledge and to create their own understanding.

Storytelling as a teaching strategy

Helps explain expectations strengthen character and teach desired behaviour within a workplace. When a speaker turns information into a relatable story with a lesson attached, it's easier for the audience to connect to and learn from it.


Benefits of the storytelling

	Kids become better listeners.	Memory becomes sharper.	





Some tips to make storytelling effective

- Empathic characters.
- Use voice modulation while narrating the story, know where to pause, where to use high or low voice frequencies.
- Connect the audience.
- > Eye contact is a must while narrating the story,
- Use various facial expressions, body gestures, and movements of hand while narrating the story.
- Interact with the audience by asking questions.
- ➤ Use of metaphors.
- Try to create an imaginary world in the mind of kids with your voice and an effective way of storytelling.
- Sometimes you can use the dramatization method or some puppet fingers to make your storytelling experience live for the children.

Promotes collaboration.




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SECOND SESSION

- But one day (5:01-6:50)


b. Each group will name a spokesperson to give voice to the story as the teacher play it once again




THIRD SESSION

- Important points in writing
- Ideas and organization
- Convey the theme and the tone, while displaying consistent narration.
- Setting details are provided in the same manner as the author's.
- Continue the story with a new conflict, climax action and resolution.
- The order of the details makes sense to the story.
- Paragraphs are connected through good transitions.
- Word choice, grammar and punctuation
- The words must be used correctly and help to make the story clear.
- The sentences must be well- constructed.
- The piece must be fluent and easy to read aloud.
- Spelling must be correct.

2. A performance


In groups of 3-5 people, you are going to prepare a performance of the alternative ending you have written. Each performance should not last less than 10 minutes.
